PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE BY CATHIE SMITH

Our hectic summer of art is finally slowing down but there are still opportunities to show off your skills. On Saturday, October 14th, we will start a new round of shows at the Hutton on Chapala. We will now only have the second floor as a show space so will keep the entry to SBAA members only and will change it out every three months with no hold overs. Complete details will be sent to the membership before the 14th. The other upcoming opportunity will be a change out at 1919 State Street on Saturday, November 11. I continue to urge you all to give it a try – it has a pretty good sales record and low entry fees. Support Gallery 113 by showing and volunteering to help keep them strong and we would like to hear any other venue ideas you might have for our bigger shows.

The last weekend in August, the SBAA was asked to partner with the Acoustic Celebration at the Fess Parker Red Lion and present an art show entitled "The Art of Making Music". Forty-three pieces were submitted and 33 were chosen to show by juror Tom Henderson. First place went to Nancy Freeman, second place to Piri Friedman, and third to Rex Kochel. Honorable Mentions went to Frances Reighley, Yuliya Lennon, and Mike Rider. While we sold no art, we had many compliments on it. The event itself was very interesting with terrific live music and a fabulous showroom of hand-crafted instruments. Thank you to all who helped make it happen.

The August Faulkner takedown was a complete success so, well done!

August 31st was the ingathering for our annual show at the Jewish Community Center. We were honored to have Frank Goss and Susan Bush as co-jurors and collected 93 entries. When the jurors had reviewed all the artwork, Frank said there wasn't a single piece that didn't deserve to be there so, all 93 entries were accepted – quite a nice compliment for the SBAA! Awards were given as follows: First place

went to Rica Coulter, second place to Stephen Sherrill, and third place went to Peggy Odgers. Honorable Mentions were awarded to William Hull, Victor Elsey, Edward Rodgers, Marie Isabelle Dalbadie, and Louise Komp. The reception on Thursday, August 7th was the usual excellently planned evening that the JCC provides – printed programs, delicious refreshments, wonderful live music by Trudy and Oscar, and an awards ceremony led by Frank Goss. Total attendance was 140 guests and artists – we are so fortunate to have this partnership with the JCC.

A reminder that we will have an ingathering for New Members on Monday, September 25th, at the Faulkner Gallery. The following Sunday, October 1st, from 2-4 we will have an orientation at the Faulkner for the new members selected and current members are invited to attend if you'd like to refresh your knowledge of how the SBAA works.

2018 POLICY CHANGE FOR ARTIST OF THE MONTH & FEATURED ARTISTS

The Board of Gallery 113 has revised the policy of wall rental payments for the above artists. Traditionally the rental payment of the above spaces has been made at the ingathering, (usually the Sunday preceding the First Thursday Reception). Starting in January, 2018, the policy will change and artists will have to make a check made out to Gallery 113 and mail it to Katy Zappala, 1241 Dover Lane, Santa Barbara CA 93103 for their wall space rental. Katy sends out an AoM info packet 12 weeks prior to the ingathering of the Artist of the month and FA information packets 8 weeks prior to the Featured Artists' ingathering. All artists will be responsible for sending their rental checks to Katy within two weeks of receipt of their information packets.

If she does not receive a check from a Featured Artist within the two week period and she is unable to contact them, the wall will be offered to another artist in time for the substitute artist to take advantage of all Gallery 113's free publicity. If Katy does not receive a check from The Artist of The Month within the two week period, she will notify Manny Lopez, the Business Manager. If he is unable to contact the artist, he will assign the space to another artist on the AoM list.

We feel this will help alert artists of their upcoming shows and avoid the possibility of "no shows" which hurts all presenting in the Gallery.
